200 Chain Breakers

200 years ago a significant historical event took place – the Slave Trade Abolition Bill was passed in Parliament which marked the beginning of the end of three centuries worth of British involvement in the transatlantic slave trade.

200 years later thousands are still trapped in a contemporary slavery - sexual exploitation.

'We say that slavery has vanished from European civilization, but this is not true. Slavery still exists...its name is prostitution' Victor Hugo (1802 – 1885), writer

Whilst many have yet to acknowledge it, prostitution is a major problem in the United Kingdom and the people it affects often need considerable long term support to bring lasting change to their lives.

There are over 40 organisations who have decided to work together as the National Christian Alliance on Prostitution, a registered charity which exists to unite, equip and empower projects and initiatives who seek to offer freedom and change to those exploited in prostitution. With the support of almost 800 volunteers, the network has been able to offer help to over 4,000 women, men and some children working in prostitution.

NCAP does not charge membership fees to organisations who join our network. Operating this way allows for a greater degree of inclusiveness to those with limited financial resources who would otherwise be prohibited from participating. We are therefore financially dependent on the generosity of individuals, churches and our supporters

As we commemorate the bicentenary of the Abolition of the Slave Trade Act this year, would you stand together with us in offering freedom and change to the thousands of people caught up in prostitution?
